Pope Francis' Message for Trinity Sunday

...“We are not called to live without the
other, above or against the other, but with
the other, for the other and in the other”.

...the Holy Spirit “guides us towards full
knowledge of Christ's teachings”, and that
Jesus “came to the world to acquaint us
with the Father”, everything in Christian life
– he said – revolves around the mystery of
the Trinity”:

“So let's pitch our lives high, remembering
for which glory we exist, we work, we fight,
we suffer; and in which immense prize we
are called to participate in”.
