*In the Chaplaincy Centre – entrance via the Blackburne Place gates.

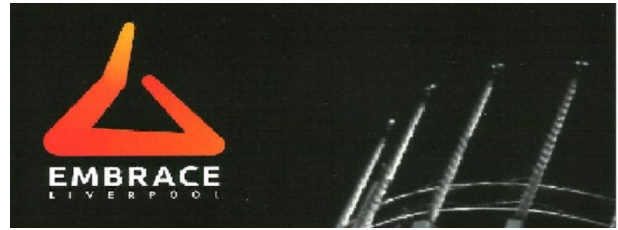
Liverpool John Moores University Students

Inviting you to MORNING PRAYER & BREAKFAST on Tuesdays & Wednesdays.

A great way to start the day! St Paul advised the Thessalonians to pray without ceasing. This may seem very demanding for an individual but maybe makes more sense for a community. The Church offers us an official rhythm of prayer called the Liturgy of the Hours or sometimes the Divine Office or Breviary, which is largely based on ancient poems or songs called Psalms. These verses can be found in the Old Testament and would have been well known to Jesus and prayed by him. Each part of the day is allotted a number of Psalms together with readings, silence, prayers and hymns, which change on a four-week cycle and also vary with the different liturgical seasons. Catholics throughout the world can be united in such a way that there is always someone, somewhere praying the Liturgy of the Hours. Every Tuesday and Wednesday you can experience Morning Prayer here at the chaplaincy at 8am. The prayer takes roughly 10minutes and is followed by breakfast and great Coffee. Why not give it a go and learn more about this ancient and living tradition?
